### **Bing: Clinical Assessment Of Malingering And**

The detection of malingered auditory verbal hallucinations in clinical settings may be particularly vulnerable to false positives and false negatives due to low suspicion on the part of clinicians, low utilization and poor specificity of psychometric testing, and “iatrogenic malingering” that is less likely to include cartoonish claims and more likely to involve voice-hearing as a sole presenting symptom (i.e., monosymptomatic auditory verbal hallucinations).

Careful clinical interviewing, identification of secondary gains, and supplemental psychological testing provide the best approach to assessment. Once a diagnosis of malingering is made, clinical management that recognizes iatrogenic causes and disincentivizes misrepresentation by addressing legitimate sources of distress can be therapeutic and can help to confirm the diagnosis.

Cases of intentional feigning are organized into factitious disorder (FD) and malingering. The latter is not a formal diagnosis, but rather a condition of clinical concern.

To summarize, malingering is a constant concern when conducting a forensic assessment. The detection of malingering requires clinical acumen as well as sound psychological assessment. Tests have been developed to assist the forensic

psychologist in identifying malingering. However, no single test should be used as the basis for a forensic decision.

Malingering has been conceptualised in three categories: pure, when non-existent clinical problems are feigned; partial, when actual symptoms are exaggerated; and false imputation, which refers to the deliberate misattribution of actual symptoms to the compensable event.

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
