Caries -- a word that means "rottenness" in Latin, this is the gradual decay and disintegration of a tooth. The decay can affect the tooth's soft or bony tissues.
Cavity -- hole or weak area in a tooth, caused by tooth decay (caries). Composites -- tooth-colored materials used as fillings or bonding to restore teeth.
