### **Kings Indian Defence Samisch Variation: Tirabassi, M ...**

The Saemisch response to the King's Indian - developed by Fritz Saemisch - anchors the e4 pawn solidly while also preventing ...Ng4 as a response to Be3. The future play may involve a wild game with opposite-side castling, or an attempt by White to slowly squeeze Black using his space advantage. Pros:

The Nimzo Indian Defence is a chess opening where Black wants to give up his bishop pair to double white's c-pawns on the Queenside. What is the Nimzo-Indian Defence? When this is done (called the Samisch Variation), Black wants to close up the board (by blocking white's pawn center), so White can't utilize his bishop pair as an advantage.

A typical beginning to the king's indian defense. The King's Indian Defense is a chess opening for black that can be played when your opponent begins starts with d4, the Queen's pawn opening. The main idea for black is to let white gain initial space in the center while black develops minor pieces to attack the center later.
